

C.V. of Dr. Damian Tobin

Damian Tobin is Lecturer in Business and Management at the Centre for Finance and Management Studies, SOAS, University of London and is academic director of the International Management (China) distance learning programme. As part of this he has co-authored distance learning courses on international corporate governance, domestic and international issues in China's economy and research methods for management. He has published on topics related to China's state enterprise reform, financial globalisation, corporate governance and public sector growth. His articles have appeared in such academic journals as *World Development*, *Corporate Governance: An International Review*, *Journal of Chinese Economic and Business Studies* and *Asian Case Research Journal*. He has also contributed to private sector studies on such topics as corporate governance practices in Hong Kong and China, the relationship between big business and the political system and briefings on China's economy.

Prior to this, he completed a PhD in Finance and Management at CeFiMS on the topic of *Corporate Restructuring, Governance Reform and International Listing in China's Leading Corporations*. This involved both quantitative and case study analysis of China's leading state enterprises and their attempts to converge with international "best" corporate and management practices and included fieldwork in Hong Kong and Mainland China. Prior to his PhD studies, he graduated from the University of Limerick, Ireland with a B.A. (Hons) in Public Administration. As part of this he spent time living in, and studying the transition economies of Central and Eastern Europe and later completed a Masters in Business Studies (Economics) by dissertation, on the topic of *Corporate Governance and State Enterprise Reform in China* at the University of Limerick.
